

FAMED CABARETS MAY BE CLOSED

Col. Hayward Starts Action
to Close the Little Club
and Knickerbocker Grill
—Many More to Come.

New York, March 19.—Proceedings were listed a few days ago in the United States District Court by Colonel William Hayward, United States District Attorney, for the purpose of closing the padlock for one year, three of the best known and most prominent cabarets and restaurants in the heart of the city. These are Shanley's Restaurant, Forty-third street and Broadway; the Little Club, 216 West Forty-fourth street, and the Knickerbocker Grill, Forty-second street and Broadway, which is in the old Knickerbocker Hotel Building. Repeated violations of the Volstead act are ascribed as the reason the Government seeks to close the places, and follows similar action taken several months ago in padlocking for twelve months the cabaret formerly famous as Reinseweber's, Fifty-eighth street and Eighth avenue.

The actions started yesterday are only three of twenty-five similar suits which will involve prominent Broadway places. The other actions are to be started within a few days. Palmer Canfield, head of the legal division of the local prohibition office, aided Sanford H. Cohen, Assistant United States Attorney, in the preparation of the cases. Recently Mr. Canfield said that there would be several hundred injunction proceedings to close places that are alleged to have continued to violate the Volstead act.

Astors Among the Defendants.
In the case of the Little Club the defendants are the Chateau Thierry Hotel & Restaurant Co., Inc., Benjamin Cohen, Henry J. Valloft, John Jacob Astor, Jr., Charlotte Agnes Astor, William Astor, Caroline Astor and the Shubert Realty Company, Inc. The Astors are the owners of record of the premises, the Shuberts are lessees, Cohen is President of the defendant company, and Valloft is manager.

The defendants in the case of the Knickerbocker Grill Company, Inc., is Joseph Paul, who is also the manager. The other defendants are Knickerbocker Grill Company, Inc., the Knickerbocker Forty-second Street Company, Inc., Harry S. Stewart, George S. Rogers and Arthur A. Kelley. The grill is located in the basement floor of the Knickerbocker Hotel building and has been in operation for several months.

Complaints filed yesterday charged that each place has repeatedly violated the Volstead act. The Government asks that the places be declared closed, and that the owners be fined. There are about 2,000 cases on the docket awaiting hearing, but that twenty-five white light district places had been decided upon for trial first.

About fifty affidavits have been filed against the cabarets and restaurants whose cases are scheduled for trial next month. Two hundred of the affidavits were made by policemen and the other 300 by Federal prohibition agents.

Mr. Canfield expressed confidence yesterday that because of the alleged overwhelming evidence against the defendants there would be no doubt of the closing of the places when they are called for trial next month. He bases his optimism partly on the attitude of the courts in the Reinseweber case. That restaurant, then known as the Paradise, was recently closed by injunction because of alleged violations of the Volstead act. The case went to the United States Circuit Court of Appeals, which sustained the lower court in directing the place be padlocked for one year.

E. C. Yellowley, Acting Federal Prohibition Director for this State, said yesterday: "It is our intention if possible to close every one of the places in the White Light District, against which we have sufficient evidence of violation of the national prohibition act. All of the places named in the affidavits have openly and flagrantly violated the law and some of them are still doing so. We are going to keep after them until we drive them out of business."

Raid Near "Lucky" Restaurant.
Federal Prohibition Agent Samuel Kurzman, known as "Sammy the Painter," made a raid yesterday only a few doors from the home of Izzy Eisen, widely known federal prohibition sleuth. Kurzman raided the cafe of Solomon Schlinger, 107 Ridge street. The raid was on a search warrant signed by Commissioner Hitchcock. Nine gallons of whiskey, eighty-four gallons of wine, fifty-seven gallons of alcohol, plus cans and barrels of seltzer and a still were seized. Schlinger was locked up at the Clinton Street Police Station charged with violating the Volstead act. Kurzman was assisted by Agents Canter and Gibney in making the raid.

The trial of ex-Judge Harold L. Hart, former Federal Prohibition Director for this State; William A. Orr, former secretary to Governor Whitman, and others, charged with conspiring to defraud the Government and to violate the Volstead act, was postponed yesterday until today on account of the continued illness of Federal Judge Francis B. Winslow.

The police of the Glendale Police Station yesterday raided the elder store of Henry Reynolds, 2,604 Myrtle avenue, Brooklyn, and arrested the owner on a charge of violating the Mullan-Gage law.
