LABORATORY REPORT

Re: Dennis MASSON - Murder - Onion Lake Dist.,
Saskatchewan

1. The following exhibits were received by me on
2-12-42 for examination in the above connection:

- 4231-522A Two two-quart sealers containing brain
tissue from the body of Genevieve MASSON
- 4231-522B One single-bit axe.
- 4231-522C One blue overall smock "GPO" Brand.
- 4231-522D One greyish cloth cap with red lining.
- 4231-522E One red and white bandana handkerchief.
- 4231-522F Blood taken from the heart of Genevieve
(Mrs. Dennis) MASSON.

2. These exhibits have been examined with the
following results:

- 4231-522B There are blood smears on either side of
the blade, near the cutting edge, of this
axe. These blood smears are found to be
human in origin.
- 4231-522C Stains widely distributed over left and
right front, left lower lateral and both
sleeves are noted on this smock. These
stains are found to be blood and are human
in origin.
- 4231-522D A large area measuring $2\frac{1}{2} \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " shows stains
on the left latero-posterior area of this cap.
These stains are positive for blood which is
human in origin.
- 4231-522E Small stains are noted near the outer borders
of this handkerchief. These stains are posi-
tive for blood which is human in origin.
- 4231-522F This blood belongs to Group "O" of the
International Classification.
- 4231-522A The brain was submitted to routine toxicolog-
ical examination for the special purpose of
detecting the presence of Ethyl Alcohol. Neg-
ative results were obtained in this examina-
tion.
