ENGLAND TRYING TO HOLD JAPAN IN CHECK. There Will Not Likely be Any Trouble Over France's Breach of Neutrality.

LONDON, May 16.—At the foreign office today the Associated Press learned that Foreign Secretary Lansdowne had made no further representations to the French government regarding the continued stay of the Russian Pacific fleet in Cobein-China waters.

No alarm is felt in government circles here that Japan will permit her protectorate to go so far as to produce a rupture of peace, but it is fully recognized that Japan has the power to bring her ally into conflict by a hostile act.

Baron Haysashi, the Japanese minister here, said to the Associated Press today that he was positive that if France sent a definite demand to St. Petersburg Vice-Admiral Rodziansky would not remain in French waters 24 hours. Minister Haysashi characterized as absurd the French charge that Japan intended ultimately to attempt to annex Cobein-China.

PUNISHMENT FOR CHILD STRIKERS.

CHICAGO, May 16.—Strikes of school children who have quit desks by hundreds in sympathy with the teamsters to be dealt with sternly, according to President Clayton Mark, of the Chicago board of education. It is alleged that in many cases the parents, rather than the children are responsible for the strike.

FAMOUS WRESTLER HAS TYPHOID.

NEW YORK, May 18.—George Hackenschmidt, the wrestler, arrived in New York last night from St. Louis, and drove from the station to the Hotel Astor in a cab. A physician was called at once, who confirmed the diagnosis of typhoid, says the American. Hackenschmidt was kept in bed last night, and his temperature had a large number of engagements were awaiting him, beginning May 27. He is in hopes that the sea trip will help him, but those who saw him last night were convinced he would not be able to leave when he expected.

SAD ACCIDENT AT MILLTOWN.

Young Boy Loses His Life at a Dumping Ground.

ST. STEPHEN, May 17.—A young lad named Guy McCracken, fifteen years of age, met death in a sad way at Milltown, Maine, this forenoon. He was employed driving a horse and dump cart that carried refuse from one of the lumber mills to a dumping ground. Part of the road was very rough, and in passing there the cart was upset and landed on top of the boy. He was alone, and when search was made for him his body was found beneath the heavy load with life crushed out.
