LONDON IS UNSIGHTLY JUST NOW On Every Vacant Piece of Ground Grandstands are Being Erected in Preparation for Coronation Pageant.

London, May 2.—The approach of the coronation is not improving the appearance of London just at present. For it is necessary, the numbers of carpenters in the country being, after all, limited to make a start with the erection of grandstands for the minor stands in the city on the day of the Coronation will be exceedingly costly owing to the way the wages of carpenters will soar as the multitude of orders come in for the stands in shop and house windows. As at the last Coronation, prices may also be had for stands on such precarious coils of vantage as the house-tops.

Some statisticians have ventured to guess that 5,000 miles of planking will be needed for the stands used on Coronation day and on the day of the Royal progress through 7 1/2 miles of London's streets.
