COUNCILLOR CARSON THE NEW WARDEN OF COUNTY COUNCIL

He Wins Out on Second Ballot in an Election with Councillors McLeod and Hayes—Estimates for Year Passed—Special Assessment on Parish of Lancaster.

At the meeting of the County Council yesterday the new parish representatives were seated. Thos. B. Carson, of Simonds, was elected warden, and a levy of \$120,789 for general county purposes was ordered. A special levy of \$5,838 upon the people of the parish of Lancaster for local services was also ordered.

The following from the city: Councillors McGoldrick, Green, G. T. Jones, Elkin, Hayes, Codner, Smith, J. B. Jones, Russell, McLeod, Wigmore, Potts, Scully, Christie. After the new councillors had been declared elected, Warden Cannon called for nominations for the office of warden.

On the first ballot the vote was: Carson, 9; McLeod, 8; Hayes, 6. Councillors Wigmore and Potts moved the second ballot, but were dropped for the second ballot.

The score however, does not tell the full story of the game, as the Crescents gave the Socials a hard run right through. The ice was in poor condition, which made fast skating difficult but both sides put up a strenuous fight and it was replete with clever stick handling and good combination rushes.

LAS VEGAS A BIDDER FOR FIGHT. Las Vegas, N. M., Jan. 16.—Las Vegas today became a bidder for the Johnson-Flynn battle of July 4, next, when Charles O'Malley, a local promoter, wired to Jack Curley an offer of \$100,000 for the fight. Since the granting of statehood, there is no law in New Mexico against globe contests as these events were prohibited only by federal statutes.

TROUBLE IN THE 'FRISCO FIGHT TRUST. San Francisco, Cal., Jan. 16.—The prize fight trust of this city is having trouble in obtaining permits from the new board of supervisors after the police commission apparently had settled the programme of fights for a month or so ahead. Charges made before the board caused the applications again to be referred to the commission.

RACERS WEREN'T IN HURRY. Despite the very stormy weather there was a large attendance at the Victoria rink last night to enjoy the skating and witness the two mile race. There were seven starters in the race which could not be called a good contest, as it was too slow. The starters were W. J. Thorne, W. Bell, H. Garnett, E. Ingraham, L. Coleman, H. Belyea and M. Bell.

At the crack of the pistol the skaters left the line as if they did not intend to finish the race in an hour's time. Only about three of them took the pace during the contest, and it was a tiresome contest. The management at the next long event will probably put a time limit on the race, and if not skated within the limits no prize will be given. The first half mile was taken in two minutes, and during the time the skaters were talking to each other as they went round the rink at a funeral pace. The mile was finished in the slow time of three minutes and 55 seconds. Two laps from the finish Belyea spurred, and went well in the lead of the others, and he finished the two miles a winner by a few yards, with Coleman in second place and Garnett third, the time being 7 minutes, 32 5/8 seconds.

The starter was William Magee, who also discharged the duties of referee and clerk of the course. He also called out the laps and held the bell rung to warn the skaters of the last lap of the race. He neglected to ring the bell until the skaters had only a half lap to finish, and it was then that all but Belyea and Garnett up, skated hard, thinking that they had another lap to go, and thus at the finish of the extra lap Garnett was in the lead. The crowd who did not know at the time that an extra lap had been skated, thought that Garnett was the winner until told about the matter after the race.

Canada Wins the Trophy. Montreal, Jan. 16.—Canada won the Gordon International Curling Medal today, eight rinks of Montrealers disposing of eight rinks representative of the United States.
