HEV. HENRY H. HALL

Wells Depot Pastor Appears Before Kennebec Court To Answer To Murder.

Kennebunk, Sept. 12—Henry H. Hall, the Wells Depot lay preacher, was held without ball for the grand jury on the charge of wife murder; at the conclusion of his preliminary hearing to day before Trial Justice H. H. Bourne. The grand jury meets on Sept. 17 at Alfred.

Nine witnesses were examined by the state, the last five of whom, including Hall's daughter Frances, aged 14, corroborating that given by those who testified before the noon recess. No evidence was given for the defense. It was charged by the state that Hall killed his wife, formerly Minnie O. Stevens of Harrington, a trained nurse, on June 11 at Well's Depot, where he had been acting as pastor at the Baptist church since the first of the year, although not yet ordained. Mrs. Hall died of concussion of the brain in a Biddeford hospital four hours after falling from a railroad bridge over a brook, according to Hall. The opera house on the upper floor of town hall, with a seating capacity of 700, where the hearing was held, was filled, mostly with women.

Mrs. Frances Stevens of Harrington, mother of the dead woman, and Hall's daughter, Frances, aged 14, were summoned by Hall's counsel, but it was not certain whether they would be presented at the preliminary hearing.
