TIE-ON SLEEVELESS SWEATER

Among the latest of sweaters is the tie-on sweater. This model is somewhat like the scarf-knitted in a straight piece with the neck opening and the underarm seams not sewed but left open. Cast on 88 stitches with No. 6 needles, knit 25 inches. Bind off 24 stitches in centre of neck. Neck opening is knitted six inches long on one side; second side is then made; and the two sides joined again by casting on the 24 central stitches. Knit until front is like the back. Try on and locate the waistline desired. At this point pick up 20 stitches on each side of front and knit each long enough to go around back and cross and to the front and tie. Finish ends of each and sweater with three inch fringe if desired.

HER MISSION HAS BEEN FULFILLED

The Spirit of Joan of Arc Today Unites the People of Britain and France.

Paris, May 21.—In an article which Le Martin published recently, former President Poincaré, writing of the canonization of Joan of Arc, says that the spirit of the "Maiden of Orleans" links France and England today in a unity upon which depends the future peace of the world.

"It is today," he says, "that Joan of Arc builds the last part of her mission in bringing together forever in the sacredness of her memory, the heroes of those she sought to push out of her kingdom and the descendants of the chivalry who fought beneath her banner."

"From the flames which burned Joan of Arc came the spirit of light, and truth which has finally associated, in common accomplishment after long centuries of misunderstanding, the peoples of France and England. Joan gave to the wavering and uncertain people a dynasty around which was formed our national unity."

"She made possible the France of Francis the First, of Henry the Fourth, of Louis the Fourteenth, of the revolution and of today. If at the same time she helped expel England from the Continent, she simply convinced our neighbors across the Channel to their national destiny and in reconciling them, in spite of themselves, to their insular traditions, she prepared them to assume the mastery of the seas. For long centuries the two peoples, seated on opposite sides of the Channel, regarded each other
