Narcotics Valued at \$200,000 Seized in New York-Main Source of Supply.

New York, Nev. 13.—Narcotics having a wholesale value of \$50,000 and a veldor's value of \$200,000, were confiscated by federal agents and members of the narcoties squad of the police department in a raid tonight on the apartment of Santh Parest, 36 Middson street. Acting Captain Henry Scherr and Raiph Oyler of the Internal Reverne Department, who conducted the raid, believe they have run down the source of supply of vendors who have been very active recently in the district.
