ARKET YOUR POULTRY ALL YEAR ROUND

Disposing of Surplus Stock When Market is Not Glutted Brings Better Returns

Distribute the sale of market birds over as many of the twelve months as possible. Sell when the price is good and the birds ready. As far as possible, get out of the habit of market may everything in the fall of the year. Watch the markets and have your inds ready when you can get the wices.

The best prices are received for hens in the spring of the year. A good plan is to cull out all the hens you do not intend to keep over for breeding purposes another year and seil as soon as the egg yield drops. This will occur after the breeding season is over and usually along about the list over all the breeding season is over a little bit later.
