

# MARCHING

### Hungary Calls on Lo

WILL OPPOSE THE ENTENTE.
COPENHAGEN, March 24.—Detachments of the Russian Bolshevik armies were reported, in a Berlin dispatch today, to be marching towards Budapest to aid the new soviet government republic established in Hungary. The dispatch said a state of war has been declared against the Entente and that a general mobilisation has been ordered in Hungary.

Dispatches from Vienna said the Bolshevik envoys in Budapest have promised that the main forces of the soviet armies would be ready to march into Hungary within a few weeks. The newly formed workmen's ministry in Budapest is said to be headed by Alex ander Garbais. The Hungarian soviet republic according to a Budapest dispatch has sent a wirele's message to Premier Lenine, asking him to come to Budapest and personally take charge of the situation. Lenine was greeted as the "International Leader" and was assured of Hungary's solidarity. He is said to have replied, asking that he be kept constantly advised of the "military situation."

Count Karolyi, in announcing the resignation of his ministry, is ued a proclamation declaring allied occupation was intended to make Hungary "the jumping off place," for operations against the Russian Bolshevik, with the aid of Czech troops. He said the workmen's and soldier's council had decided that they must form an armed alliance with the Bolsheviki against the \*Entente.

#### U.S. Exports to Britain Show Big Decline

AMERICAN EXPORTERS COM-

AMERICAN EXPORTERS COMPLAIN

WASHINGTON, March 24.—Three months of near-peace find American concerns far behind their pre-war stride in exports to England, as a result of British import testrictions.

Export of most cammodities except food, is unning millions short of pre-war shipments, so United States commerce reports show.

Complaints are flooding the department from American exporters, who flocked to England upon the signing of the armistice, eager to resume normal commercial relations. These complain and say the refusal of the British board of trade to license imports is shutting Americans out of many English markets in which in 1918 there was a big demand for American goods.

It is resisted out that the English

It is pointed out that the English import restrictions do not apply to goods from British colonies. U.S. manufactured products show the greatest falling off, according to the commerce reports.
