The Honorable the Speaker presented to the House, a Return from the Clerk of the Crown in Chancery, setting forth that His Excellency the Governor General had summoned to the Senate the Honorable John O'Donohoe, of the City of Toronto, Queen's Counsel; the Honorable John Schultz, of the Province of Manitoba; the Honorable Louis R. Massen, of Terrebonne, in the Province of Quebec; Josiah Burr Plumb, Esquire, of the Town of Niagara, in the Province of Ontario, and Louis Robitaille, of New Carlisle, in the Province of Quebec, Doctor of Medicine.

The Honorable the Speaker informed the House, that there was a Member with out, ready to be introduced.

When the Honorable Louis R. Masson was introduced between the Honorable Sir Alexander Campbell and the Honorable Mr. Chapais.

The Honorable Mr. Masson presented Her Majesty's Writ summoning him to the Senate.
