In the Fortnightly Review Mr. J. Henniker-Heaton, M.P., makes an earnest plea in favor of "Universal Penny Postage." The writer wants penny postage the world over, and holds it quite feasible, too. Last year the post-office made a profit of three millions sterline, and this he considers contrary to public policy, as out of this service no profit at all should be made. The objection that there would be a permanent loss by universal penny postage he considers ridiculous in the light of experiences since the introduction of Rowland Hill's great boon and of postage stamps. But his strongest point of all is his contention that great speed in transmission is not demanded by more than a small section of the writing public, which section, again, now makes free use of the cables when speed beyond anything that steam can achieve is desired. It is notorious, he asys, that all urgent matters of business are now settled by the use of the telegraph and cipher codes.
