FISHERIES HISTORIAN TO GIVE

MACNUTT MEMORIAL LECTURE

An authority on fisheries in Newfoundland will deliver this year's W. Stewart MacNutt Memorial Lecture at the University of New Brunswick in Fredericton on Tuesday, Oct. 26.

Entitled *100 Years of the Fishery Crisis in Newfoundland*, the lecture will be held at 8 p.m. in Tilley Hall, room 102. Rosemary Ommer, research director for the Institute of Social and Economic Research at Memorial University in St. John's, will offer her evaluation of the crisis in the Atlantic fisheries and how Newfoundland communities have managed.

Dr. Ommer will also present her lecture at UNB Saint John on Wednesday, Oct. 27 at 5 p.m. in Oland Hall, room 206.

The MacNutt Memorial Lecture was established in 1980 to honor the late W. Stewart MacNutt's many contributions to UNB. A noted historian, prof. MacNutt was instrumental in developing the study of Atlantic Canada history.
