Dear Mr. White.

I have your letter of the 3rd. instant with regard to the sale of timber on the Gibson Reserve, and am pleased to send you herewith a copy of the advertisement calling for tenders and also a statement of the burnt and damaged timber covered by the sale, with an estimate of the value.

The Department accepted the highest tender which was as follows:- for Hemlock \$6.81 per M. ft. B.M., for Hardwood \$6.51 per M. ft. B.M., and for rough and undersized wood \$1.00 per cord.

In view of the interest you have in the sale of this timber it occurs to me that you might think it advisable to send in an officer of your Department to see if the operations of the successful tenderer, who is Mr. Archie McGibbon, Penetanguishene, are confined to the timber specified.
