Sir,-

I have to request you to be good enough to proceed at your early convenience to retrace the boundaries of the two Indian Reserves shown on the tracings herewith enclosed being No. 19 at the mouth of the Genesee River, Parish of St. James, county of Charlotte, ^{and} No. 22 being on the East shore of Chipewatin Lake, Parish of Madam, county of York, N.B.

Transect lines should be run, and they should be well blazed, at each angle and corner of the reserves, and at intersecting lines of adjacent properties, plant a substantial post of cedar or other durable wood, and mound it well with stones, if these can be obtained within a reasonable distance; mark the letters I.R. on the side of the post facing the Indian reserves.

If the boundaries of the properties on the ground are practically the same as shown on the tracings herewith new plans will not be required. If, however, you find any material discrepancy you should prepare new plans on a scale of 20 chains to the inch showing the measurements thereon that you have made, and the posts you have planted.
