

- Q. Was the liquor pure or mixed?
A. He drank it straight.
- Q. How big glasses was he taking?

A. He was staggering and his speech was not the same.
- Q. Did you believe him able to drive his truck at that time?
A. Yes sir, I thought he could do it.
- Q. How far did you go before either or both of you stopped?
A. We went to Bn Hq to have our work tickets signed.
- Q. How long were you there?
A. 5 or 6 minutes approximately.
- Q. Do you know if either of you had anything to drink while you were there?
A. No sir.
- WEB* Q. How far did you go before you stopped again?
A. Starting from Bn Hq Pte Brisson started in the wrong direction for at least a 1000 ~~xxxx~~ yards where we had to stop on this side of the Support Coy and we had to turn around there.
- Q. And where did they stop next?
A. We next stopped at the scene of the incident.
- Q. Why did you stop there?
A. I don't know why, we stopped, he stopped first we had no reason to stop.
- Q. Do you know the name of the road or street where you stopped?
A. No sir.
- Q. Do you know the numbers of any of the houses in the vicinity where you stopped?
A. No sir.
