# HOMESTEAD

### REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 28, which has not been home-s-eaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other put-poses, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, more or less. or less. ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District

in which the land to be taken is s'iunte, or if the homesteader de-sives he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is siluate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee-entry entry

of \$10 is charged for a homestead HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been grouted ar entry for a homestend is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following schemes.

(1) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three

each year during the term of three years. (2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any per-sen who is eligible to make a home-stead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the yleinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-stead, the decurrents of otherholder, mised residence prior to obtaining person residence satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother. (3) If a settler has obtained a retent for his homestead, or a cer-tificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner pre-scribed by this Act, and has ob-tained entry for a second home-sized, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first home-stead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first home-stead. residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person

stead. (i) If the settler has his per-manent residence upon farming hand owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term "ticinity" used above is meant to indicate the same town-ship or an adjoining or connecting township.

A settler who avails binself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestend, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their ac-commodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially ferced. Every homestender who fails to comply with the requirements of the homestender law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

### APPLICATION FOR PATENT.

Should be made at the end of the three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inthree years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead In-spector. Before making application for patient the settler must give six Commissioner of Dominion Lands months notice in writing to the at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

### INFORMATION.

INFORMATION. Nextly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winnipeg, or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitola or the Northwest Territories, information as to the lands that are open for exity, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing lands to suit them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Domin-for Lands in the Railway Belt in Fritish Columbia, may see obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interlor, Cutawa; the Commissioner of Im-migration. Winnipeg, Manitoba; or to any of the Dominion Lands Agents in Manitoba or the North-west Territories.
