Mitchell (Jno.). A Map of the British and French Dominions in North America, with the roads, distances, limits, and extent of the settlements, inscribed to Lord Halifax, *on the scale of about thirty miles to the inch*, 14.50. 118

This is a very large coloured map, on one sheet, folded on linen; it is in fine condition, and of its rarity and importance there can be no question, and should have been before the Boundary Commissioners on behalf of the Dominion Government.
