After which His Excellency was pleased to make the following Speech:

His Excellency's Speech. Mr. President and Gentlemen of the Council, Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Assembly,

"HE public business being happily completed, I embrace the pleasing occasion to prorogue the General Assembly; and I confidently rely on your exerting the fame candour, harmony, and public spirit, in your respective districts, that have so much distinguished your deliberations during the Session.

Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the Affembly,

"I thank you for the Supplies you have fo liberally granted to His Majesty:—They fhall be faithfully applied. We may reasonably expect that a g ound is now laid for establishing the public credit, greatly to the honour as well as to the general benefit of the Province: Considerations which I trust, will not fail to render the contributions requisite thereto, acceptable to every citizen who loves his country."
