HOUSE of ASSEMBLY. Fredericton, tuesday, sth Juify, 1808.

THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY haring been Prorogued to this Day then to meet for the dispatch of Busincss. The House met accordingly.
A MESSAGE was delivered from His Honor the President requiring the attendancc of this House in the Conncil Chamber. The House attend:ed accordingly and being returned, Read a first time, "A Bill for the bet"ter encouragement of Agriculture and Fishery." The Speaker then reported that the House had attended His Honor the President in the Council Chamber, when His Honor was pleased to make the following Speecr to both Houses, and that to prevent mistakes he had procured a copy of the same, which he read in his place, and is as follows, to wit:

## "Gentlemen of the Councril, " and Genticmen of the Assembly,

"His Majesty having thought fit to direct the most active measures to " be taken for strengthening the defences of the British possessions in North "America, and having been graciously pleased at the same time to express " his reliance upon the Legislatures of the respective Provinces for making " every exertion consistent with their internal resources, with a vien to the "General Defence; it became my duty on being appointed to the Admi" nistration of this Government, to give you without delay an opportunity " in General Assembly, to fultil His Majestr's just expectations, onothis " momentous occasion, by such legal Provisions, as our situation may re"quire, and by making such ameadments as may be necessary in the pre" sent Law for regulating the Militia of this Province:
