Ordered, that this House do agree to join in the Address, as requested by the House of Assembly.

Ordered, that a Message be sent down to the House of Assembly requesting a further conference on the subject matter of the last conference; and that the same Committee who managed the last conference do manage this, to meet in the Committee Room instant.

Ordered, that the Order for the committing of the Bill relating to Marriages, which stood for yesterday, be the Order of the Day for Friday next.

A Message from the House of Assembly, by Mr. Owen:

“Mr. President,

“The House of Assembly do agree to a further conference, as is desired by His Majesty’s Council, on the subject matter of the last conference, and have appointed the same Committee who managed the last conference to manage this conference.

“House of Assembly, 1st Feb. 1832.”

Whereupon the Committee went to the conference; and being returned, reported the substance thereof.

Ordered, that the President do wait upon His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, and acquaint him that the limited number of the Legislative Council in attendance this Session, has, in several instances, caused great delay and inconvenience in transacting the Public Business before them—the absence of one Member from sickness, or any other cause, preventing the Council from forming a House.

Adjourned until 1 o’clock to-morrow.
