draft an Address to His Excellency the Governor General, founded upon the Resolution just passed.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative upon the same division.

The House was adjourned during pleasure.

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr Patton reported from the said Committee an Address prepared by them as follows:

To Ilis Excellency the Right Honorable Sir Edmund Walker Head, Baronet One of Her Majesty's Most Honorable Privy Council, Governor General of British North America, and Captain General and Governor in Chief in and over the Provinces of Canada, Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, and the Island of Prince Edward, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY:-

We, Her Majesty's dutiful and loyal Subjects, the Legislative Council of Canada, in Provincial Parliament assembled, respectfully beg leave to represent to Your Excellency that this House having heard the explanations offered to this House by the Organ of the Government therein, beg to express their entire dis-satisfaction therewith and their want of confidence in a Government which is not prepared to enunciate a policy upon the various questions which the Members therefore while in opposition agitated with so much zeal.

Which said Address being read by the Clerk,

The Honorable Mr. Patton moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Prince, That the said Address be adopted.

The question of concurrence being put thereon, the same was agreed to upon the same division.

The Honorable Mr. Patton moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Prince, That the foregoing Address be engrossed and that the same be signed by the Honorable the Speaker on behalf of this House.

The question of concurrence was put thereon, the same was resolved in the affirmative upon the same division.

The Honorable Mr. Patton then moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Prince,

That the said Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor-General by the whole House.

The question of concurrence was put thereon, the same was also resolved in the affirmative upon the same division.

Then the Honorable Mr. Patton moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Taché,

That such Members of the Executive Council as are Members of this House do wait on His Excellency the Governor-General, humbly to know what time His Excellency will be pleased to appoint to be attended with the said Address.
