RISKED LIVES TO SAVE GUN

Heroic Action of Two Drivers
of the Royal Field
Artillery

Remarkable bravery is attributed to two drivers of the Royal Field Artillery in the battle of Mons by Lance-Corporal Bignell, of the Royal Berks Regiment, who was wounded in the engagement and is now home at Reading. Bignell says:

"These brave drivers brought a gun out of action with shells bursting around them. They had noticed that the gunners had been all killed, but calmly and heroically walked their horses down to the gun.

One driver held the horses under a terrific fire, while the other limbered up, and the gun was brought safely back, neither men nor horses being hit. They had a miraculous escape.

"As we watched them from the trenches we thought it impossible for them to escape death. Shot and shell were ploughing the ground up all round them. It was magnificent bravery and worthy of high recognition."

FRENCH DOCTORS SHOW HIGH SPIRIT

Must Give Careful Attention
To Enemy's Wounded as
Well as Our Own

The following letter received by the parents of a doctor serving with a French infantry regiment at the front shows the admirable conception which the French medical corps has formed of its duties:

"I am still well. Despite a period of very hard work, I write to you as often as possible, and I hope my letters reach you quickly. Since our baptism of fire which now dates back a month, we have been fairly comfortable, as our good friends the English say, and are in want of nothing, tho' if some small thing should be lacking we cheerfully do without it. So have no anxiety on my account.

"Since you have taken upon yourselves the duty of devoting yourselves to the service of the victims of the war, take good care of our wounded, but give attention also to the wounded of our enemy. That is the great side of our splendid mission—to do good to those who have done evil to us. All the medical service at the front has been engaged in doing this body and soul since the firing of the first shots, and in spite of its losses this will continue."

Under the provisions of "The Stamp Acts, 1898-1914," the following Rules and Regulations respecting Stamp Duties, in substitution for those of date September 15th, 1914, have been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council.

1. Every instrument shall be stamped on its face, when possible.
2. Cancellation of stamps shall be made by the person cancelling, writing, printing or perforating his name or initials with date across stamp.
3. Bills of Exchange, Cheques, Promissory Notes, Bills of Lading, Shipping Receipts, and Charter parties shall be stamped and the stamps thereon cancelled as follows:—

(a) Bills of Exchange, Cheques and Promissory Notes drawn or made in the Colony by the person signing the same; provided that in the case of a cheque on a Banker, the Banker to whom it is presented may, if it is unstamped, stamp the same and cancel the stamp.

(b) Bills of Exchange, Cheques and Promissory Notes drawn or made outside the Colony by the Person in the Colony into whose hands any such bill, cheque or not shall come unstamped before he in any manner negotiates or pays the same.

(c) Bills of Lading executed outside the Colony by the consignee in the Colony into whose hands any such Bill of Lading may come before he in any manner negotiates the same.

(d) Bills of Lading executed in the Colony by the shipper. Provided that if any Bill of Lading is presented to any person or Company for signature unstamped, such person or Company may stamp the same and cancel the stamp.

(e) Shipping Receipts by the shipper. Provided that if any Shipping Receipt is presented to any person or Company for signature unstamped, such person or Company may stamp the same and cancel the stamp.

(f) Charter Parties by the person in the Colony last executing the same.

(g) Charter Parties executed wholly outside the Colony by the person in the Colony into whose hands any such Charter Party comes unstamped before he in any manner uses or takes any action upon such Charter Party.

4. The person upon whom the obligation to stamp and cancel any instrument is imposed by these Rules shall be deemed to be a person issuing an instrument, and, if he fails to stamp such instrument with its proper stamp, or to cancel such stamp, he shall be liable to the penalties imposed by Section 22 of the Act 61 Victoria, Cap. 14, entitled "An Act respecting the Payment of Certain Fees and charges by Stamps."

5. Any Rules and Regulations which may have been heretofore made under the provisions of "The Stamp Act, 1898-1914," are hereby rescinded.

At St. Michael's Church Name Festival Observed On Sunday Last

The festival of St. Michael and all Angels or Michaelmas and the patronal festival was observed Sunday at St. Michael's Church. The altar was draped in festal white and gold and decorated with a profusion of beautiful flowers.

There was a celebration at 8 o'clock at which a large number made their communion, the celebrant being the priest in charge. The chief service of the day was a Missacantata at 11 o'clock, the Rev. A. G. S. Stamp was celebrant, assisted by the Rev. J. Brinton as deacon, the processional being "Bright the vision that delighted."

The sermon was preached by the Rev. J. Brinton, speaking from Revelation, "Michael and his Angels," and gave a brilliant discourse on the nature of angels in their ministrations in heaven and their guardianship at Christ's Holy Church and Sacraments and concluded with a touching reference to the Newfoundland Regiment and committed each member to the care of a Guardian Angel.

Evenson's was sung at 6.30 by the Rev. A. G. S. Stamp who also preached from Revelation, "There was war in heaven," and gave a very instructive address on the Hosts of the Heavenly King.

Hymn No. 423, "Stars of the morning," was sung for the procession which followed, after which was sung a solemn Te Deum as an act of thanksgiving.

The blessing brought to a close another happy festival and another milestone passed in the history of St. Michael's Church.

The hour of sale has been made to suit people living in the nearby settlements.

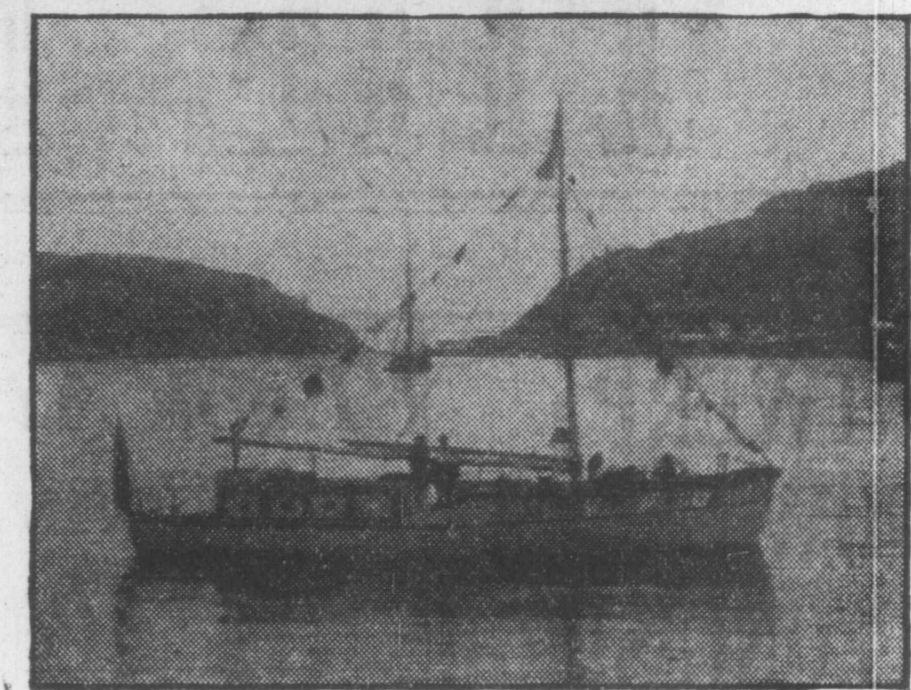
