GAME LAWS OF ONTARIO

The following excerpts from the game laws and regulations of Ontario are published here-with by the request of License Inspector Johnson: The purchase or sale of wild ducks, wild geese, or other water fowl is prohibited.

Hares may be taken by any means or at any time between the 15th day of October and the 23rd day of November, and the 2nd day of January following, and may be taken at any other time by any means other than shooting.

No open season for partridge until 1918.

No open season for pheasants until the 15th day of October, 1918. See Order in Council.

Squirrels: (Black and Grey)—Open season from the first of November to the 15th day of November, both days inclusive. No open season in several counties. See Order in Council.

No partridge, quail or woodcock may be bought or sold.

Muskrats: Open season in that part of the province lying south of the French and Mattawa rivers, from the first day of March to the 21st day of April, and in that part of the province north of the French and Mattawa rivers from the first day of April until the 21st day of May.

No person shall hunt or trap fur-bearing animals except under the authority of a license, but this shall not apply to farmers or farmers' sons trapping on their own lands. License fee, \$5.

Buying and selling: Persons buying and selling protected fur-bearing animals, or the skins of protected animals require a license. License fee, \$2.

Persons engaged in the business of buying and selling game require a license, fees graded from \$1 to \$25.

Persons engaged in the business of cold storage of game require a license, fees \$5 to \$15.

It is illegal for hotels, restaurants or clubs to supply game for or as part of a meal during the closed season, except under authority of a license; fees, \$1 to \$10.
