VAGARIES OF FIGURES ARE EXCEPTED IN U.S. DRAFT

Drawings Showed Laws of Chance— Holders of Low Numbers Shown to Have an Advantage of Twenty Per Cent

An analysis of the first 3,000 drawings in the draft lottery at Washington, says the Boston Globe, reveals some curious vagaries in the operation of the so-called laws of chance. Inasmuch that there had been such previous lottery in the United States since the Civil War, it was an expected opportunity, so far as the present generation of Americans is concerned, to study the workings of those laws on a big scale.

In a general way the drawings showed the truth of the mathematical proposition that even "chance" must submit in the long run, to a higher law, namely the law of averages.

Thus, in the 3,000 capsules opened at Washington, the registration numbers, 1 to 4,999 came out 1,404 times, or 46.6 per cent of the drawings. These numbers, 1 to 4,999, represented approximately 47.5 per cent of the 10,500 capsules. This was a variation of the law of chance from the law of average of but 1/10th of 1 per cent, and on the same ratio, would have totalled less than 2 per cent in the entire 10,500 capsules.

Curious Changes

But in the first 600 drawings the registration numbers 1 to 4,999 came out 307 times, or in 51.1 per cent of the drawings, as against 47.5 per cent that should have come out under the law of averages.

The number of capsules containing the registration numbers 1 to 4,999 in the five series of 600 capsules each was as follows:

First 600 capsules	307
Second 600 capsules	275
Third 600 capsules	283
Fourth 600 capsules	282
Fifth 600 capsules	265

These figures, showing as they do a reduction in the first 600 capsules of the number of serial 1 to 4,999 drawn out, are in general accord with the actual mathematics of the law of averages.

For it is evident that, under the actual conditions, the number of capsules containing any series of figures that can be drawn out will gradually diminish toward the end until the whole series is exhausted.

There were very considerable variations in the totals of the drawings in the serial thousands in the first 3,000 capsules. Of the 100 capsules contained the registration numbers 1 to 999.

There were 298 of the capsules containing the registration numbers 100 to 1,999.

There were 274 capsules holding the registration numbers 2,000 to 2,999.

There were 281 capsules in which were the red numbers 3,000 to 3,999.

298 capsules appeared the registration numbers 4,000 to 4,999.

The number of capsules containing registration numbers above 4,999 were as follows:

5,000 to 5,999	238
6,000 to 6,999	238

Had Big Advantage

First of all the figures show that the young man whose registration number was below 1,000 was in much less danger of being drawn in the first 3,000 capsules than was the holder of any red number above 1,000. He had a 20 per cent advantage over the holders of registration numbers 1,000 to 3,999, or 4,000 to 4,999.

But in the first 600 capsules drawn there was an especially peculiar situation. In that 600 capsules only 50 contained the red numbers 2,000 to 2,999, as against the following others:
