## Annual Report Eastern Health District of N. B.

 also for some wells the water of which showed pollution with typhoid bacilli, also to Waugh District and upper Pokemouche where 2 cases of Small-Pox were reported. Went to Alexandria, Kent Co. where Typhoid Fever was reported to be at a house and 3 cases were down with that disease, one of whom had died in the Moncton Hospital. Visited Bathurst and Caraquet, 3 samples of water taken for examination because of Typhoid Fever in the houses near the wells.

Oct. 20 called to Nashes Creek for case of Small-Pox in one of the back settlements, called at Lorne, found two persons affected, quarantined two houses and took all necessary precautions to prevent spread of disease. From the last named place I went to Sackville and Collega Bridge to see about having Medical Inspectors for the schools appointed, as the Doctors had refused to act. Had an appointment for Sackville and good prospect of having one act for Dorchester Parish. Was at Campbellton Oct. 28 for meeting of the Subdistrict Board at which collectors of Vital Statistics were appointed and bills passed, also examined at Expector for working of the Health Act from August 1st to Dec 31st, 1919 were made and forwarded to the Chief Medical Officer.

During the year several samples of water have been sent to the Provincial Bacteriologist for examination and in his report wells ordered closed. No cases of legal action were entered into as I have tried to have such disputes settled amicably. Three cases of V. D. have had to be taken care of by the local Boards as the patients were unable to pay for treatment.

As my district is half of the Province and some parts quite inaccessible, I have had to do quite an amount of travelling and the correspondence with the different Boards was considerable.  
 I have done my best during the past year to make the Public Health Act a success in this district. Good results have been attained and I look forward with confidence to greater achievements in the coming year.

**CALLING A SPADE A SPADE**  
 Never be caught saying that because you used agricultural lime you have fertilized your soil. You might just as well condemn the use of automobiles because you had a rough ride in a wheelbarrow shovels or other. Lime on the soil makes better yields even where no plant-food is added. This has been proved by many tests. Our Department Station in a field test extending over more than 20 years shows that by using the soil once in a five year rotation the yield of wheat was increased from 17 bushels per acre to 29 bushels, or 41 per cent. This was where lime was added without any other manure or fertilizer. Where fertilizer was added alone the average yield of fertilized wheat rose to \$5.04 bushels per acre, but where lime was added two years before the fertilizer was used the fertilized yield was \$9.29 per acre. You are then left with a responsible fact, an increase in wheat of about 4 bushels per acre. New York Agricultural Experiment Station fully summarizes the value of lime as follows: "The Ohio experiment illustrates the fact that lime does not take the place of other fertilizers or manures but supplements them."

 Just how much lime to use depends on soil conditions, climate, and the condition of soil.  
 More fertilization is needed in sections having less bushels per acre where the soil is thin and the fertilizer is not so effective. Most of the wheat raised in this district is on one acre which has been heavily fertilized so to have a large yield per acre.  
 The lime is a natural supply of phosphorus. This, with other fertilizers, makes a complete fertilizer. A man of plant food in each fertilizer bag, second grade manure, bone-meal, and other fertilizers.
