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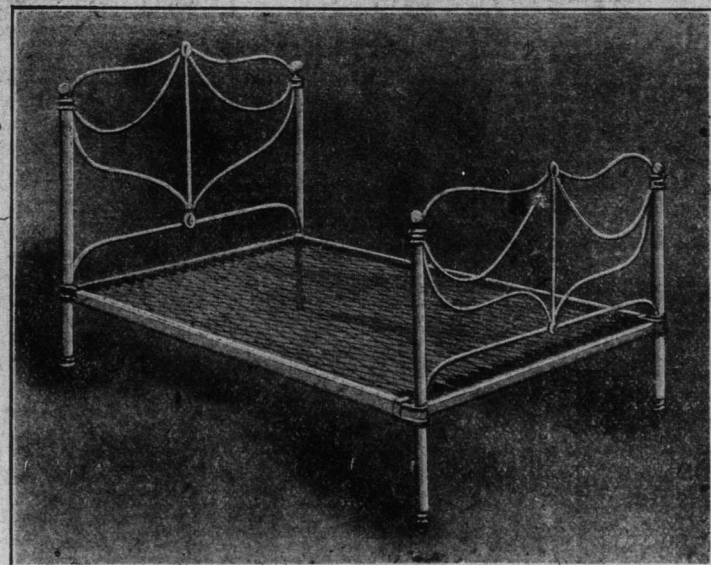

C. L. B. W. and N. C's Annual Meeting.

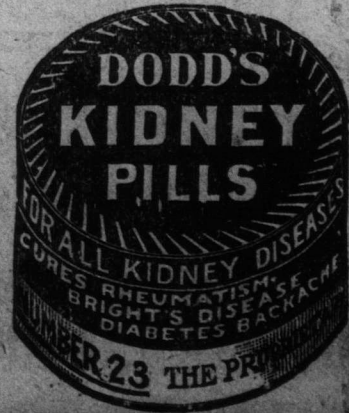
The annual meeting of the C. L. B. W. and N. C's. mess took place in their Armoury Thursday night.
