Suez Canal Company's Report.

The Canal directors dwell with satisfaction on the noteworthy growth of the company's receipts, which was accompanied during the past year by a decrease in expenditure. These facts, coupled with the removal of a substantial charge on the funds due to the complete repayment of the consolidated coupon bonds, have enabled them to recommend a material increase in the dividend, while at the same time they have been able to allocate from the profits a sum of 25,000,000 francs to pay off a part of the installation expenses recently effected. Shipowners have also been privileged to participate in the prosperity of the undertaking, and the Canal directorate are not backward

on this account. Drawing attention to the fact that the rapid growth of the traffic enabled them to reduce by 25 centimes the Canal dues on shipping as from March 1 last, they add in a characteristic passage that this concession appeared to them opportune "in order to conform to the liberal policy of enabling shipowners who are still to-day suffering the consequences of a formidable crisis to benefit from the reascent prosperity of the Suez Canal, and to contribute their share to lighten the burdens which weigh heavily on the industry of marine transport." 
