Then there was the miserable bungling and total incapacity displayed in relation to the acquisition of Manitoba and the rebellion which afterwards broke out there, by which incalculable injury was done to that Province. And close on the heels of that came the union of British Columbia to the pominion, with the extravagant subsidy, the violation of the constitution magiving it so many representatives, and the enormous expenditure on
