**Five Years For Norbreck**  
Cour D'Alene, Idaho, June 11.—In the federal court here this morning Judge F. S. Dieckhoff sentenced P. C. Norbreck, convicted of having misappropriated funds of the Wallace National bank, to serve five years in the federal penitentiary at McNeil's Island, giving him the minimum sentence.  
Imprisonment is for conviction on two counts. The other indictments, which charged the making of false entries in the books of the bank, were dismissed.

### INDUSTRIAL BUILDING BYLAW PASSED BY THE COUNCIL

Measure Appropriates \$250,000 for New Building and Will Be Resubmitted to People in About Three Weeks; Quick Action Given.

### PARKS AND FIRE HALLS ALSO GET MORE MONEY

Applications Already in Hands of Commission for All-Space in New Structure; Charges Will Be Based on Nominal Rental and Sinking Fund.

The industrial building bylaw, to appropriate \$250,000 for the purpose of constructing a building to house small industries, was passed at an adjourned meeting of the city council at 10:30 yesterday morning. The bylaw, after the usual period of explaining, will again be submitted to the people for action, the vote being due in about three weeks.

### BENGOUGH SUFFERS FROM SEVERE STORM

Moose Jaw, June 11.—On Sunday there was a severe electrical storm over Bengough in the south county, ranching and farming districts. Several buildings were struck by lightning, one of them, the residence of A. L. Hubbard, six miles southwest of Bengough, the stove was shattered and several people were injured. Mrs. Hubbard and her children were slightly burned. About the same time a cyclone, which was blowing from a small town in the south county, not far from the boundary, one of the elevators at Colgate was blown down and a box car blown from a siding onto the main line. The lumber yards at Pangman were badly damaged and one livery barn was blown down and the church steeple and many other things were scattered around Pangman and the huge black cloud could be clearly seen from Bengough.

### FORESTERS WILL HOLD HIGH COURT TODAY IN CALGARY

Hundred Delegates Expected From All Parts of Province; Officers Elected for 3 Years

The session of the High Court of Alberta of the Independent Order of Foresters will open in this hall this morning at 9 o'clock, when the various committees will be appointed and the work of the day will be commenced. High Chief Ranger Webster will preside, and Assistant Chief Ranger G. A. Mitchell of Toronto, it is expected that Mayor Simeon will attend at the afternoon session and formally welcome the foresters to the city. The Chief Ranger replying on behalf of the visitors. It is expected that there will be in attendance about 100 delegates from the 35 lodges in Alberta. There will be 25 delegates from the three Calgary lodges. An executive meeting was held in the King George Hotel last evening to make arrangements for the session, and all the high officials of the province were in attendance.

**Officials to Be Elected.**  
A large party of delegates arrived from Edmonton, and it is expected that there will be a keen rivalry for the various high offices of the order in Alberta. The chief contests will be for the position of High Chief Ranger, and of delegates to the session of the Supreme Court, which is to be held in Montreal, Georgia, this fall. The election will be held at the afternoon session after the addresses and the presentation of reports of committees. The officers will hold their positions for the next three years, during which there will be a demonstration of initiative work by the Calgary lodges, with a full court of honor. Refreshments will be served after the ceremony, and all foresters are invited to attend at the evening session.

Kinney, Edmonton; High Secretary E. A. Johnston, Calgary; Treasurer, J. A. Nolan, Calgary; Physician, Dr. J. W. Holton, Strathcona; Counselor P. W. Abbott, Edmonton; High Chief Ranger W. L. Olson, Calgary; and W. C. Bryan, Alberta; Woodward, G. C. Patterson, Okotoks; Junior Woodward, C. R. McGowan, Killam.

### BIG LUMBER MILL IS DESTROYED WITH ENORMOUS LOSS

Damage at Prince Albert Will Amount to Over Half Million Which is Insured; Favorable Winds Saved the Offices and Power House.

### BIG RIVER LUMBER COMPANY IS LOSER

Big Consignment of Lumber of Thirty Million Feet Saved; Shipping to Go On in Meantime Till Mills Are Rebuilt and All Work Resumed.

Prince Albert, Sask., June 11.—Word reached here at noon today that the main part of the Big River Lumber Company's mill, consisting of the department used for the manufacture of logs into lumber was destroyed by fire shortly after 7 o'clock this morning. Loss amounted to \$500,000 which is covered by insurance controlled by Osher Hammond & Nanton of Winnipeg. Offices, warehouses, power houses, planer and electric generators were saved mainly because of favorable wind and sufficient work done by mill water service.  
The fire is believed to have originated from hot box just after the mill started up. In 45 minutes the main structure collapsed. The engine house which is fireproof was connected with the mill only by main driving belt and the latter was burned off where it entered the engine house, leaving latter intact.  
The mill was one of the largest on the continent and probably the best equipped. It was completed and started operations for the first time in June, 1911. It was cutting 600,000 feet of lumber in a 24-hour day and there was being shipped daily from 13 to 16 cars. It employed about 625 men, and of these 400 will be thrown out of work at present. Col Davidson of Toronto is president of the company, and Sir William MacKenzie is director.  
Oscar Sharpe, general manager of the mill who was in the city, left today for Big River. There is a cut of 30,000 feet in the yards and shipping business will not be affected as there is sufficient supply available from this to keep up with the demand. General Manager Sharpe stated that the general business of the mill would not be affected and shipping would continue.

### MAWSON IS DUE BACK FROM VANCOUVER THIS MORNING

City Planner and Manager of His English Offices Prepare for Final Conference

City Planner Thomas H. Mawson will return to Calgary this morning from Vancouver, where he has been straightening out that city, and resume work on the new plan for the laying out of Calgary.

James Crossland, manager of the Mawson offices at Lancaster, England, returned yesterday morning to Calgary and spent the day in getting together the ends of the work here. He is in the city hall, with correspondence and tracing the better part of the day.

"I expect Mr. Mawson in Calgary tomorrow," said Crossland. "He has been unexpectedly delayed in Vancouver, but the work here is not being neglected. We will have several more conferences in this city with the various heads of departments, and will finish our work of gathering material for the preliminary plans in about two weeks or so. The real drawing of the plans will take place in our Lancashire offices, and I expect to be back here, either with Mr. Mawson or alone, early in the autumn."
