TORONTO, March 31—11 a.m.—The depression to the west of the lakes is central tonight over Wisconsin. It is causing a general fall of rain over Ontario, Eastern Canada. It is mild throughout the Northwest, and is moving or sliding in the Northwest. Minimum temperatures: Calgary, 40°-43°; Port Arthur, 35°-38°; Winnipeg, 30°-33°; Kingston, 25°-28°; Montreal, 24°-27°; Quebec, 16°-20°; Halifax, 25°-28°.

Local temperature—Highest, 31° above zero; lowest, 28°.

TORONTO, April 1—1 a.m.—The indications for the day and for the lower lakes region covering the peninsula and as far west as Belleville are: Mostly cloudy, with a little higher temperature.
