Plain Bavarian Cream. Sauté half a box of gelatine in half a pint of cold water. Freeze through a sieve one pint of cream or freshly steamed and sweetened plums. Stir the gelatine over boiling water until dissolved; stir the plums into this and mix well; pour into a bowl set in ice, and stir constantly until it begins to thicken; then add one pint of whipped cream; stir lightly until well mixed. Turn into a mold and stand in a cool place. Serve with whipped cream.

When planning for a social or a supper the following rule of proportions is a good one to keep. To serve 20 persons, five loaves of home made bread, two pounds of butter, four pounds of boiled ham for sandwiches, two pounds of coffee, one pound of loaf sugar, and two quarts of cream for the coffee, and seven leaves of cake will be sufficient.
