Skull of World's Heavyweight Cham-pion Found To Be From One-Half to Twe-Thirds of an Inch Thick.

San Francisco, Cai., March 24—Jack Johnson, heavweight champion of the world, submitted to an X-ray picture being taken of his skull today, and it required more than five minutes for the electrical rays to penetrate the heavy cartilege covering the champion's skull and make a picture on a piate. The surgical savants present marvelled at the thickness of Johnson's skull, which measures from one-half to two-thirds of an inch. 


