COMMITTED FOR TRIAL

Charged With Intimidating C. P. R. Employees.

Peterboro, July 2.—In the preliminary hearing before Police Magistrate Edmondson tonight, John Hayes, a bluff and constable of Arden, was committed for trial upon two charges of intimidating the employees of the C.
