Boston, June 7.—The New Brunswick Tourist Association's visit here has developed in importance and interest and probable good results far beyond what was expected. It closed with a big, enthusiastic meeting to-night in Ford Hall at which Premier Veniot was the chief speaker.

He gave facts and figures wreathed about with eloquent language explaining New Brunswick's situation and telling what it had to offer.

A battery of newspaper writers representing the Boston dailies reported the meeting, showing what interest the Boston invasion had aroused. Group pictures and long articles marked today's issues reporting the earlier events. New Brunswick has certainly received publicity of much value and in generous quantities.

Mr. Baskley again presided tonight. A verse of "America" and one of "God Save the King" opened the meeting and after the chairman's introductory words a Glee Club of Canadian Club members sang "O Canada" very nicely, the audience standing in tribute to the northern neighbors.

State Treasurer Jackson expressed the regrets of Governor Cox at his inability to be present. Mr. Jackson had spent several vacations in New Brunswick and he paid tribute to its beautiful resources and its scenic beauty.

J. Frank O'Hara president of the Boston Interoceanic Club went over him.

The defendant had been fined \$25 with the option of a two months' jail sentence.
