RABIES AROUND LONDON. The Mad Bog Scare in the County of Mid-dleser Discussed by the Provincial Board of Health.

The Provincial Board of Health met yesterday. There were present: Chairman Rase, Oshawa; Dr. McDonald, Hamilton; Dr. Vaux, Breckville; Dr. McLay, Woodsteck; Dr. Cassidy, Toronto.

The principal subject of interest dealt with was the late mad dog scare at London. A communication was received from Dr. A. B. Graham of Dorchester, bringing before the board the case of a farmer named Filkenson, who was bitten by a mad dog about May 20. It was proposed that the man be sent to the Pasteur Institute in New York. On motion of Dr. Cassidy it was decided to ask Dr. J. J. Mackenzie to make full enquiry into the case. It was also decided that the board pay one-third the expense of sending Frikenson to the imitiate on condition that the township and county councils of Dorchester and Middlesex undertake the remainder.

On May 21 a latter was received by Dr. Bryce, the secretary, from the secretary of the London Board of Health suckosing a newspaper clipping giving an account of the case of A. Tafts of London, who was stack. A by a dog suffering from rabies. The letter recommends that the Provincial Government deal with the matter.

The report called attention to several insanitary conditions on Centre and Western Island. A request was sent to the board for additional inspectors. The annual spring inspection of the public schools 37 in number) was made and 18 were found to be in an unsatisfactory condition. Of the 7 separate schools 3 were found all right and 4 otherwise. Certain defects were also observed in the Normal and Model School and Collegiate Institute. A case of typhoid having developed in St. Michael's College a thorough investigation of the plumbing of the building was made with the result that it was found very defective.

Dr. Canniff has renewed the war against cow byres and has notified all keepers of such animals within the city limits that they must be remeved forthwith. The total number of complaints received in May was 1995.

Augusta, Ga., Jume 18.—Elbert county furnishes another lynching. About three weeks ago George Penna, a negro boy about 18 years old, was arrested and lodged in jail in Elberton in default of \$100 bond, to answer to the charge of criminal assault alleged to have been committed on W. S. Butler's 14 year-old daughter, who lives in the upper part of Elbert county. Penna was held in jail until last week, when John Hall, who lives in the same neighborhood, went to Elberton, signed Penna's bond and took the boy home with him. Hall, apprehensive of Penna's safety, made him stay in the upper story of his house.

About midnight last Thursday night, while Penna was feat asleep, a mob of about 25 masked men went to Hall's house, went up stairs, got Penna and took him away. No more was heard of him until last evening, when his body was found in the Broad river, 13 miles from Elberton, with a 40 pound rock tied around his neck and three bullet holes in his head. The body was brought to Elberton yesterday, and a coroner's jury was empanelled. The evidence developed the fact that Hall was at home, but complained of being sick and did not get up when the lynching party came. The verdict of the jury was that the deceased came to his death either by gunshot wounds or drowning at the hands of unknown parties.
