MB. HAGGART MAKING AN ESTI-MATE OF THE ENTIRE COST.

Amendment Defeated on Division. OTTAWA, June 12.—The greater part of the afternoon session was taken up with Mr. Charlton's amendment to the motion to ga into supply, in which he brought up the old matter of the Tay Canal construction. The motion was defeated by a vote of 58

for to 101 against.
