The Central Church is rapidly recovering from the effects of the disastrous fire which destroyed its church, home and the homes of a number of its leading members. The corner stone of the new church was laid on the 28th of June,

1899, by the President of the Conference. The new church will be three blocks further up the hill than the old one, being now on the corner of Queen's Avenue and Sixth street. Ample accommodation is being provided for the various departments of the church, the Sunday school being provided with a semi-octagonal annex, which will give superior facilities for successful Sunday school and League work. It is expected to open this church free of debt. The Sunday school has increased both numerically and financially, and although under difficulties it has been able to maintain its high standard. The League has been doing good work, and its devotional meetings are very helpful. It is proposed to start a vigorous campaign in League work as soon as the new quarters in the church are ready.

There is a talk of changing the name of Central to Queen's Avenue Methodist Church.

Principal and Miss Sipprell have left for the east, going via Kootenay and the Crow's Nest Pass, and returning in September. Rev. W. A. Sipprell, a brother of the Principal, who has just completed his university course in the University of Manitoba, winning the Governor-General's medal, will accompany the party from Winnipeg to Ontario.
