GREEN PEA Sour .- Boll three pints of green peas in three quarts of water; when perfectly soft, rub them through a columder, then put back the pulp into the water, which is supposed to be still boiling, season with salt and pepper and butter, and thicken slightly with flour.

CINNAMON ROLL.—Take one cup of sour cream, one cup of sugar, half a cup of melted butter, one egg, one leaspoonful of soda; mix butter, one egg, one teaspoonful of soda; mix as if you were making cookies; use flour enough to have a light dough, but suff enough to roli; roll this out and scatter ground cinnamen over it, then roll it up as if for a jelly-cake and bake. This may be served as a pudding also, if hot wine sauce is peured over it as soon as it is taken from the oven.
