so ago designed to bring Red China into the United Nations? What is the meaning of press references indicating that Canada, as a result of United States action, had been manoeuvred out of its position in the United Nations?

Mr. Pearson: The words "manoeuvred out" are the right hon. gentleman's words. We have not been manoeuvred out of any position at all. We are discussing the matter with our friends in the United Nations in the hope that there will be negotiations which will bring about a forward movement in this matter.

TAMPERING WITH MAIL BY STORE MANAGERS

On the orders of the day:

Mr. Frank Howard (Skeena): Mr. Speaker, I wish to direct a question to the Minister of Justice or to the Solicitor General—to whichever hon. gentleman has jurisdiction over this matter—and ask whether an inquiry will be launched into allegations made today before the Indian affairs committee that certain Hudson's Bay Company store managers have interfered with Her Majesty's mail by burning Eaton's, Simpsons-Sears and other competitors' catalogues so that they could not get into the hands of people whom Hudson's Bay serves. Another allegation is that these managers have been opening other people's mail containing money or cheques.

Hon. L. T. Pennell (Solicitor General of Canada): I undertake to look into the matter and I shall discuss it with my officials. If it appears that further action is necessary, action will be taken.

WEST GERMANY—REOCCUPATION FOLLOWING GROWTH OF NEO-NAZISM

NATO—ASSIGNMENT OF CANADIAN AIRCRAFT TO U.S. CARRIERS

Hon. D. S. Harkness (Calgary North): Mr. Speaker, I should like to direct a question to the Minister of National Defence. Is it correct that Canadian naval tracker planes and pilots have been assigned or are to be assigned to United States aircraft carriers and, if so, is this a first step in turning over to the United States navy our anti-submarine commitments to NATO?

Hon. Paul Hellyer (Minister of National Defence): Mr. Speaker, this is the normal practice followed when the Bonaventure is in for refitting. I suspect that this practice was adopted when the hon. member was Minister of National Defence, although I have not checked that. It certainly goes back to previous occasions when the Bonaventure was in for refitting. This practice has none of the overtones suggested by my hon. friend.

MANNING OF H.M.C.S. "BONAVENTURE" FOLLOWING REFITTING

Hon. D. S. Harkness (Calgary North): I have a supplementary question, Mr. Speaker. When is the *Bonaventure* going to come out of refitting and will there be sufficient personnel to man her if she does come out?

Hon. Paul Hellyer (Minister of National Defence): She will come out of refitting as soon as repairs are completed.

An hon. Member: When will that be?

Mr. Hellyer: I presume that will be some time next year, and I am advised that we will have personnel to man her at that time.

REQUEST THAT H.M.C.S. "BONAVENTURE"
BE SCRAPPED

Mr. R. W. Prittie (Burnaby-Richmond): Mr. Speaker, I have a question for the Minister of National Defence supplementary to the one asked by the hon. member for Calgary North concerning the Bonaventure. Is the Department of National Defence giving serious consideration to scrapping the Bonaventure altogether, thereby saving the taxpayers a great deal of money?
