Before, in 1981, Canada Post was administered by ministers and public servants—by bureaucrats. There were plenty of those! What I would like to know from my hon. colleague is what is important, the colour of the trucks or delivery of the mail? It is to get the mail through in a few days, as soon as possible, so businesses can get their mail, the senior people can get their cheques and all this.
