ey onsequence of the simple method which we had adopted at first. This was no other than to take an account of the sum which each one had, deducting from that the sum each one now had left, and adding all the balances together gave the whole expense, and enabled us to complete a settlement in a few minutes. The expense to each one was short of one hundred and seventy dollars.

Monday, August 19th. The rest of the company resumed their seats in the stage this morning to Boston, on the day which completed six weeks from the time of our departure from that place. Thus terminated an excursion which had afforded us much diversified entertainment, and had also been attended with some inconveniences. These consisted principally in the various deprivations and exposures incident to travelling by water. For the encouragement of future travellers, however, we may with propriety affirm that the tour was interesting throughout, that it produced much more pleasure than pain in the performance, and that it still yields considerable amusement in retrospect.
