enough to vote against the "Hoceopath Act," will also see the injustice of Clause 30 already mentioned, and that those other members who tailed to perceive the injustice they were instrumental in producing, will see the error of their ways, and take the earliest opportunity to set themselves right in the eyes of the people of British Columbia by repealing the measure they supported last session.

In conclusion, I wish to say that I issue this pamphlet on my own responsibility and at my own expense. Neither the medical council, nor any other member of the medical profession, has any connection with it; but I know full well that my words are an expression of their thoughts. I see no one else taking any action in the matter; common justice demands that something be done; and whether the public or the profession appreciate my effort or not, I am determined to do my share towards the correction of the evils complained of.
