Besides this work, he will give a lecture on the subject "*Popular Culture*," on Thursday evening.

Mr. Alex. Cunningham, Lucan, will give an address on Thursday—subject, "*The Truly Successful Teacher*;" and, if there is time, Mr. Dearness will speak on lessons learned from the school system of Manitoba and observations at Col. Parker's Normal School, Chicago.

The roll will be called at the beginning and end of each session, 9.30, 12.00, 1.30 and 4.00 (except on Thursday morning), and the attendance reported to the trustees as usual.
