PITTSBURG, Pa., Dec. 3.—(Canadian Press.) With a concussion that broke hundreds of windows in the Borough of Avalon, six miles below this city, the boilers of the towboat Diamond exploded while in the Ohio River, while off that point, shortly before 8 o'clock this morning, killing the captain and four of the crew, injuring five others, two of whom are dying, and wrecking the boat.

CHINESE REBELS AGAIN GAINING UPPER HAND CRITICISM OF SURRENDER

Mongolia's Capital Joins Revolution—Nanking is Strategic Point For Triumphant Insurgents. PEKING, Dec. 2.—(Can. Press.)—Late developments are all unfavorable to the imperialists, whose hopes rise and fall with every change.

Various reports reaching Peking indicate that Manchuria, which up to the present has been only passively rebellious, is likely soon to become an active factor in the revolution. Gen. Chao Hsih-shan, reports that Japanese are assisting the revolutionaries, that they are importing dynamite for the rebels and even joining the rebel ranks.

The Chinese foreign board to-day called attention to the arrest of four Japanese at Mukden on the charge of throwing bombs. The Chinese officials assert that one of the Japanese confessed that a general rising had been planned for Dec. 5. The Japanese legation in answer to the protest of the Chinese government, disclaimed any knowledge of these reports, but added that efforts would be made to prevent individual Japanese from breaking their assurance when first incarcerated, that they were entirely innocent of the charge placed upon them.

Cabinet Officers Resign. Continued resignations from the government, including the victory of Yuan and the finance minister recently appointed by Yuan Shih Kai's cabinet, leave the premier more than ever a one-man government.

British Police River. HONGKONG, Dec. 2.—The British gunboats with the assistance of the American gunboat Callao, are effectively patrolling the West River. Steamers bound for Wanchow are escorted by a warship, while others are traveling in pairs for their mutual protection, their wheel houses enclosed in steel.

NANKING, Dec. 2.—Nanking is established as the base of future operations against the imperialists. It has already the appearance of a large military camp, including the foreign ships, there were twenty war vessels anchored in the river this morning, but later half the revolutionary fleet sailed for Hankow, where, it is believed, there are sufficient revolutionary troops to hold the imperialists.
