T. MURPHY WINS TWO MORE CIRCUIT RACES

Including the Feature Pace, With Direct C. Burnett in Straight Heats.

Columbus, O., Sept. 26.—Tommy Murphy, who has led all drivers for winning races in the present Grand Circuit meeting, had another big afternoon today when he won two of the four races on the program in the third Direct C. Burnett again mastered a field of fast pacers in the Arch City 2.10 stake, winning in three straight heats. Baroness Edgewood was expected to show good form, but she failed and finished outside the money. Goldie Todd was lame and in the third heat was so badly out of form that she was distanced.

In the second division of the 2.05 pace Aquilla Dillon, a western gelding, was the best of the set, and in the second heat he entered the list of new 2.05 pacers by stepping a mile in 2.04 1/4. A large field scored in the 2.12 pace, which was won by Royal Earl after he had dropped the first heat to Cherry Willis. The meeting will be concluded tomorrow with a short program of three races, the 2.18 trot, the 2.11 trot and the 2.13 trot.

HATE STILL ACTIVE

German Bomb Trophy Kills Revee Alvis of Carling Township.

Parry Sound, Ont., Sept. 26.—German bombs have today claimed another victim nearly a year after the close of the great war and the trophy which was exhibited at many fall fairs, was a small machine with a grenade, and this had been handled by hundreds of soldiers in the trenches. It was perfectly harmless. As a returned soldier placed his hand on the lever the thing exploded and the grenade struck Mr. James Alvis, of Carling, on the shoulder, penetrating his body to the centre of the chest. He was rushed to the General Hospital at once, but death must have been almost instantaneous. An inquest is being held to place the blame. Mr. Alvis was 64 years of age and reside of the township of Carling, and a director of the Agriculture Society since its inception. He leaves a wife and four sons and four daughters.

SUGAR POISONED ON TRAIN

A ton and a half of sugar, in the course of railway transit in England, became poisoned when a quantity of weed-killer poison in the same car escaped from drums and saturated the sugar. The vigilance of inspectors detected the poisoned sugar before it was delivered to its purchaser, thereby probably saving many lives.
