WHEAT IS NOT VERY ACTIVE

Little Movement in Chicago Futures

Yesterday.

Liverpool Futures Opened Higher,

But Declined Later—Maize Markets Little Changed—Local Grain, Produce and Live Stock Markets.

Notes and Gossip of the Day.

Tuesday Evening, Feb. 21.

Liverpool wheat futures to day opened steady, at an advance over night, but eased off later and closed 1/4d to 1/2d per cent lower than yesterday.

Paris wheat to day advanced 5 centimes, and flour closed 15 centimes lower to 10 higher for the day.

Chicago's speculative wheat market was not very active to day, and despite the recent goodish slump, little evidence of a likely recovery was noticeable. Argentina and other foreign news conformed bearish.

The May option this morning opened 1/2c below yesterday's close, and advanced 1/4c during the session, and then receded 1/4c, closing at the same figure as it did yesterday. There will be no session of the Chicago wheat market to day.

Liverpool maize futures to day declined 1/4d per cent. Corn was about unchanged at Chicago.

Flour declined 3d at Liverpool to day, and declined 1/2d at Liverpool, and bacon declined 6d.

Liverpool wheat receipts to day past three days 208,000 cwt. all American. Corn same time 100,000 cwt.

Bradstreet's makes the past week's decrease in the world's visible supply 1,500,000 bushels.

Exports at New York to day: Flour 15,500 bushels; wheat 54,886 bushels.

Receipts of wheat at Minneapolis and Duluth to day 570,000 bushels, and 570 cars the corresponding day of last year.

LOCAL LIVE STOCK.

The run of live stock at the cattle market here to day was large, 77 car loads, consisting of 1000 calves, 2000 hogs, 400 sheep and about 25 calves.

The quality of fat cattle generally was only medium, not enough of first-class, either in butchers' or exporters' (especially the latter) coming forward. A few straight lots of exporters came in, but the bulk of fat cattle was mixed.

Trade was fair. All first-class fat cattle found a ready market, at firm prices, but medium common butchers' stuff was inclined to be easy, as the bulk of deliveries was of this class.

Friday's prices were well maintained in nearly all the different classes of cattle.

Exporters—Choice loads of exporters sold at \$4.50 to \$4.75, and light at \$4.30 to \$4.50 per cwt.

A few picked lots of choice, heavy export steers, at high \$4.50 to \$5.00 per cwt. more was paid in one instance, but these quotations must not be regarded as being general.

The best finished choice butchers' cattle, weighing from 1100 lbs. up, were bought for export purposes, at prices ranging from \$4.40 to \$4.60 per cwt.

Loads of good butchers' cattle sold at \$4.25 to \$4.50, and medium at \$3.50 to \$4.00 per cwt.

Exports of choice heavy bulls sold at \$3.60 to \$4.00, with an odd one of extra quality at \$4.50 per cwt. extra.

Light and medium choice bulls sold at \$3.25 to \$3.50 per cwt.

Butchers' cattle—Choice picked lots of butchers' cattle, at average of \$3.50 per cwt. exporters, but not as heavy, weighing from 1100 to 1200 lbs., sold at \$4.10 to \$4.30 per cwt.
