NOW, WHO WILL EAT CROW?

The Rosslyn-Churchill Difference Would Make Some Fun if It Got Into Court.

London, Oct. 29.—The solicitors of Mr. Rosslyn-Churchill have written to the solicitors of the Earl of Rosslyn, declining, in the name of Mr. Churchill, to withdraw or apologize for Mr. Churchill's statement at the recent banquet of the Pall Mall Club, that Lord Rosslyn, in deploring and letters from South Africa, had been the cause of the death of a British soldier.

This morning Mr. Churchill wrote to the Earl of Rosslyn, repudiating the statement, and moved by personal feeling against Lord Rosslyn, but pointing out that the Earl is responsible for a "libelous statement" concerning four famous cavalry regiments.

CRIMINAL ASSIZES OPENED

Mr. Justice MacMahon Criticizes the Act Which Compels Useless Investigations

IN TWO MANSLAUGHTER CASES.

The Judge Opines That the Grand Jury Will Find "Culpable Homicide."

Mr. Justice MacMahon opened the Criminal Assizes at the City Hall yesterday afternoon. The grand jury were sworn and addressed on the duties they will have to perform. The following comprise the grand jury: Arthur P. Banks, Esq. York; Alexander Bryson, Esq. York; Thomas Culham, Esq. York; W. H. Hall, Esq. York; W. C. Harvey, Esq. York; John S. Kline, Esq. The manslaughter cases. His Lordship briefly referred to the cases to come before the court, including the manslaughter charges against George C. Hill and Edward Taverne. Hill is accused of causing the death of Harry P. Littleford by poking him in the eye with an umbrella during an altercation on Sumner-street and Taverne is alleged to have caused the death of Isaac Warner at the Humber.

After explaining the circumstances of the Littleford case, His Lordship said that the jury would probably find that the case was one of justifiable homicide. The Taverne case was something similar.

Entails Useless Expense. His Lordship expressed the opinion that the act under which it is necessary to hold preliminary investigation, and an investigation by the grand jury, besides an inquest, the evidence having to be repeated at each enquiry, had been a mystery to a useless expense. His Lordship, referring to the Taverne case, said that the punishment of whipping was enforced upon a man across the line who would soon find that Canada was not a favorable hunting ground.

Police Should Assist Them. The ticket-of-leave system was favorably commented upon. There was a complaint, however, in England that ticket-of-leave men desiring to reform were often prevented by the police from earning a livelihood. His Lordship said that the police should assist them.

True Bills Returned. The jury then retired, and about 5 o'clock returned with true bills against George Harrison and William Russell, charged with offences under the Charities Act. When the foreman of the grand jury announced that they would consider the remaining cases at 11 o'clock, His Lordship expressed his displeasure, and told the jurors that he was in their places at an hour earlier.
