# POLICE FINISH SCRUTINY GALLED ON 23,604 VOTERS

nspector Stark Furnishes Interesting Report-168 Cases of Personation Found.

The board of control yesterday deided to reappoint the deputy return ing officers who served in Ward 5 in January last, excepting Ab. Cahoon. There was some question about subdivision 11, where the police canvas showed that 19 voters who were renied having done so. A careful canvas of the nineteen was made, however, by the city clerk and by Detective Twigg, with the result that only two of the voters stuck to their statement that they had not voted for controllers. The fault may lie with the policemen who made the canvass or in the poor memories of the voters, but causes some doubt upon the accuracy of the police scrutiny.

The police have completed their canvass of the vote, and Inspector Stark, who had charge of the work in his report says:

Sir,—I have the honor to forward herewith in tabuluated form the resion, as revealed by the canvass, are elections of the city who are recorded as having voted at the municipal elections on the 1st of January last.

First, you have the results by wards, in which the conditions in each division, as revealed by the canvas, are shown, and, second, a statement in which the work in each ward is summarized in condensed form.

"One of a total of 23,604 voters canvassed, the small number who refused information (only 18 all told), is an evidence of the sympathy of the citizens with the investigation. From all quarters comes expressions of satisfaction from the canvassers with the manner in which they were received and the desired information furnished. It is scarcily necessary to add that the collection of these statistics has been an exceedingly tedious task, involving as it did a personal visit to each one of the 23,604 electors recorded as having voted, and oft-repeated visits to many of them before they could be located and the desired information obtained. In view of the labor involved I consider the remuneration offered entirely inadequate. I therefore renew my former recommendation that the canvassers be allowed 5 cents per name.





EVIDENCE IN BENNETT INQUEST. London, April 8.—The inquest on John S. Bennett, managing director of the Royal Marine Insurance Company, Montreal, was held at Rodiford, Essex, to-day. It was brought out in the evidence that Mr. Bennett had Intended returning to Montreal nett had Intended returning to Montreal on Thursday, the 7th, and had booked his passage by the Allan liner. Cashier Smith of the Victoria Hotel stated that he had cashed a cheque for fi0 for the deceased, giving him a £5 note and £5 in gold. During the previous four or five nights, he had not slept, and on Saturday last had looked dazed. Captain Richmond of the yacht Spring had seen Mr. Bennett fall, and had gone to his ald. He tried to wash the mud off his face, but deceased had pushed him away. Medical assistance was then obtained. The professional evidence showed that enlargement of the liver had occurred, that organ being six times its natural size. The loss of memory was due to this cause. A formal verdict was rendered.
