MEMBERSHIP OF 1,000 IS 1918 OBJECTIVE OF THE HORTICULTURISTS

Ambitious Plans Made at the Annual Meeting.

NEW OFFICERS ELECTED

Season Just Closed Most Successful In History of the Local Society.

Discouraging reports of the past year's work of the London Horticultural Society were received at the annual meeting of that body at the Western Fair offices Thursday night.

Officers for the ensuing year were elected and committees appointed. E. S. Potts, the retiring chairman, delivered a lengthy address on the progress of the society during the past year. He said that it had been the most successful year ever enjoyed by the association. The finances of the society were never so good, each member having been paid double the amount of his entrance fee in flower premiums. A tribute to the fine work of the F. W. Wood, member of the association, was paid by the retiring president.

Mr. Potts recommended that the society do all in its power to further the beauty of the city in the planting of flowers throughout parks and public resting grounds.

S. F. Wood was elected president for the coming year.

Good Balance on Hand. The financial report of the association showed a credit balance of \$20.95. This is considered exceptional owing to the unfavorable conditions brought on by the war.

It was decided that future meetings of the society would be held at the Western Fair offices every third Friday of each month at 8 o'clock.

The new president suggested that show, premium, membership, advertising and press committees and a committee for the distribution of flowers to charitable institutions be formed at a future meeting.

Want 1,000 Members. A particular feature of the work of the association this year will be an attempt to increase the present membership to one thousand.

In the president's address, Mr. Potts said in part: "Our membership of 619 paid members is the largest in the history for recent years. The financial statement, when presented by the secretary-treasurer, will show that, although we gave our members considerably over twice the amount of their entrance fee in premiums, we still have a substantial balance to our credit."

"Our society undertook some new plans this year which we believe brought it more prominently before the public. In the early spring Mr. Smith, who was then parks superintendent, very kindly gave us his assistance in the way of several lectures and practical talks to good audiences in the public library. These lectures, we believe, have created a greater interest in these things with those who heard them, and as a result more flowers have been ordered for the coming year."

"The Canadian Trust Company, having offered substantial prizes for backyard gardens, solicited the assistance of your district judges of same. Inspections were made at stated times and awards made, which proved of great interest."

"Two flower shows were held during the year and were very successful. The plan of giving awards was adopted, and we believe helped very much in creating a greater interest with the exhibitors."

WIFE OF PRINCIPAL IN FAKE DROWNING DIES FROM SHOCK

Never Recovered From Effects of "Tragedy."

Information by relatives has been received in the city announcing the death of Mrs. James Brandon at Springfield, Mass.

Mrs. Brandon was the wife of James Brandon, employed for some years at the Ontario Hotel, who was drowned in a fishing trip.

BACKYARD GARDENERS PREPARING TO FIGHT INSECT DEVASTATORS

Taking Up New Phase of Insuring Greater Production.

Discouragements in the way of insect pests were happily cleared up by many in London who, during the past summer, showed their patriotism by clearing up their own backyards or on vacant lots.

Members of the Women's Gardening Association, which was largely responsible for starting the gardening movement in London, believe in preparing for quite different conditions from those prevailing during the past season. They are immediately taking up a study of insect pests to combat insects, and consequently consider themselves as being in a state of readiness to give a lecture at the meeting next week on "Canadian Birds and Their Songs and Their Use in Checking Insect Life."

"There is a probability that the Gardening Association will take up the question of conservation of bird life in a manner that will impress its importance on the public in view of the necessity for maximum production of foodstuffs. It is just a year ago that the association started its campaign for backyard gardens, several months before the Government made a move in this direction."

District Figures Stand 361 to 16,256

NO CHANGE IS NOTED

Circulars Apparently Fail to Stimulate Replies Here Under M. S. A.

Ratio of reports for service as compared to the total number of reports filed under the military service act in Military District No. 1, is still less than one report for service out of every fifty men turning in a signed form. While 34 men were added to the roster of those who waive exemption claims in the returns filed with Deputy Registrar W. E. Wismer, or one man in almost 37, the aggregate brings the average report to but a trifle better than one out of every 46.

To date there have been 16,617 forms handed by the staff of the deputy registrar of this military district. Of these, only 361 have been reports for service, 16,256 having claim to exemption by the tribunal boards. Friday's returns were 34 reports, 1,608 exemption claims.

Circulars issued by the military service council have been distributed to all homes in the city, calling attention to the provisions of the act. When these will stimulate returns is questionable, for the return since the distribution started are only on the same average as before.

The circular follows:

MILITARY SERVICE ACT, 1917.

MEN IN CLASS 1. That is British subjects who were on July 1, 1917, unmarried, or widowers without children, who were 20 years old on 13th October, 1917, and were born in or since 1883, (and are not within the exceptions set out in the King's proclamation of the 13th of October, 1917), you should, whether you have been medically examined or not.

GO TO ANY POSTOFFICE. In the province in which you ordinarily live and ask the postmaster for a form.

REPORT FOR SERVICE. which you will fill in and for which you will have a receipt. Every man in Class 1 must either report for service.

OR CLAIM EXEMPTION. or exemption must be claimed on his behalf, on or before 10th November, 1917. If you propose to claim exemption, the postmaster will furnish the proper form for you to fill in and give to the first man in your class who has been medically examined who will save trouble.

ATTACHING YOUR MEDICAL HISTORY SHEET, IF YOU HAVE ONE, to the form of report for service, or claim for exemption, whichever you choose.

Last Western Ontario Unit to Cross Borders.

CASUALTY LIST IS LONG

Kilties Have Added to the Honor Roll of the District.

Although it was practically the last battalion to leave No. 1 Military District as an individual unit, the 241st Battalion has already suffered quite a number of casualties on the western front.

A little over a year ago the formation of a kiltie battalion for Western Ontario had not even been sanctioned by the Government. Now, amalgamated with the 241st Battalion, the kilties have seen over two months' service in the trenches.

As soon as the unit arrived in England it was used as a reinforcement to the 15th and 20th C. O. F. Battalions. Simultaneously with their arrival in England the N. C. O. of the battalion were required to revert to the rank of private. Sgt. Major Beck, formerly Sgt. N. C. O. of C. Company, was the first to be demoted. He had been in the trenches an hour before a spray of shrapnel service. He was wounded, among whom were Lieut. W. J. Henders, Lieut. R. H. Henders, one of the original Canadians to respond to the call of the colors, and formerly star quarterback for Toronto Varsity. Prior to leaving for overseas, the 241st Battalion was the only Canadian unit to be sent to the front.

However, when the time came for the unit to go to the front, the kilties were re-instated on the company roster. While in England, the kilties were distinguished by the Greeks owing to their language thoroughly. Eventually, however, they were sent overseas, despite their demotion. They are now doing trench duty in France.

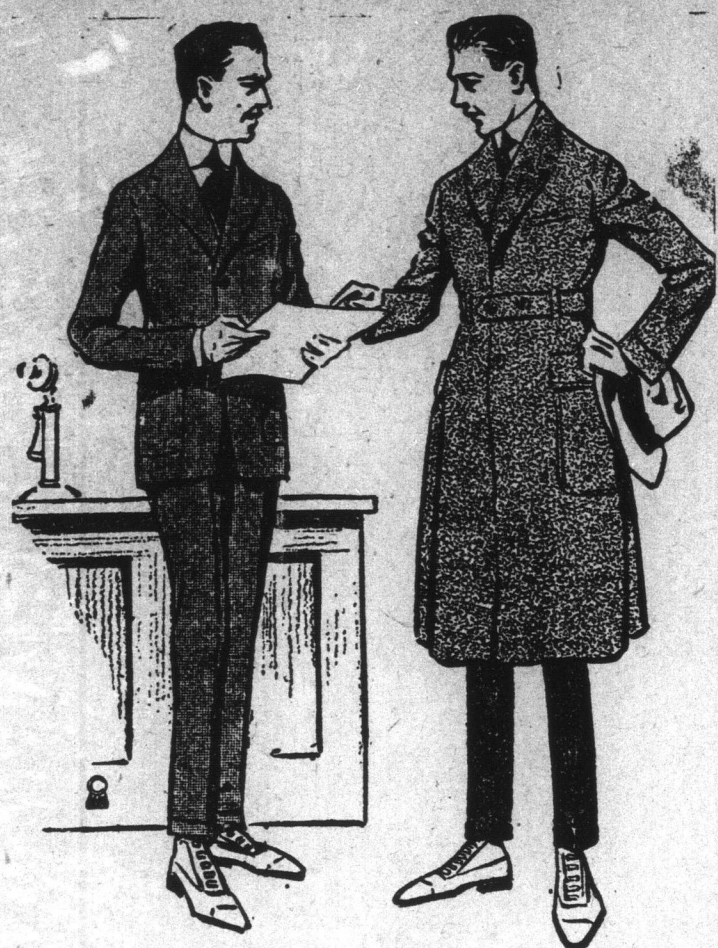

VICTORY LOAN CAMPAIGN OFFICIALLY INAUGURATED; HEARTY CO-OPERATION ASKED

No Amount Set for London, But Citizens Are Urged To Do Their Best—Over 300 at Big Meeting Last Night.

London's "Victory loan" campaign was officially inaugurated last evening at a meeting in the headquarters, Dundas street, near Richmond, and judging from the enthusiasm roused, London will be in the first flight of Canadian citizens in doing this patriotic duty.

The hall was filled with probably 300 of this city's best businessmen and public-spirited citizens. They will be called upon later to take part in the campaign, canvassing for the fund, and doing other duties of a like nature.

They were greatly stirred by the excellent addresses of Sir George Gibbons, chairman of the local committee, and Norman Sommerville, Toronto's Tablets provincial organizer. Both speeches were highly inspirational.

No Amount Set. Sir George Gibbons outlined the campaign would open on November 12 and would continue for three weeks. Canada was expected to raise \$300,000,000, and he was positive that the Dominion would welcome the chance to invest with the same eagerness, the same enthusiasm, that had offered its men for the cause of freedom and righteousness.

Urges Co-operation. He asked for the enthusiastic and hearty co-operation of all citizens. The matter would be put up properly to the people. The Government would make every effort to the public, and he was sure that when the terms were impressed upon them, they would respond nobly.

Some details of the organization were given over, and the meeting adjourned. The teams will be named shortly, and would be ready to start on Monday, November 12.
